Effective February 1, 2020, our sewer rate was raised from \$10.61 per 1000 gallons to \$15.25 per 1000 gallons. Water rates were not increased and remain at \$7.00 per 1000 gallons.

POLICE NEWS

§ 15-306 Prohibited Activities in Streets.

[Ord. 303, 3/9/1981, Art. III, § 6; as added by Ord. 357, 12/14/1987, § 3; and by Ord. 00051, 11/8/2010, § 1]

1. No person, partnership, or corporation shall, place, throw, or otherwise dispose of snow or slush upon the traveling lanes of any street within the Borough. As used herein the term "traveling lanes" is that area of each street that has been plowed for use by the traveling public in traversing any street. The term shall not include any appropriately designated parking lanes. At a minimum, the term "traveling lane" shall extend for a distance of 12 feet from the center line of each street within the Borough.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person, partnership, or corporation to throw, place, or leave grass, leaves, or any other natural materials or any trash within the streets of the Borough.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person, partnership, corporation, or other entity to allow any tree, brush, shrub, or any other natural growth or any other object to project onto any portion of any street or thoroughfare within the Borough or to allow any overhanging trees to grow (measured from the street surface at the curb vertically) under the following distances on the following streets in the Borough of Akron:

A. Fourteen feet the entire lengths of Seventh Street and Main Street, North Ninth Street from SR 272 to Main Street, South Ninth Street from Oak Street South to the Borough Line and North Eleventh Street from SR 272 to Main Street.

B. Twelve feet along any other Borough street or alley. Under Section 2, this would include piles of mulch, stone or dirt.

STORMWATER INFORMATION

Stormwater runoff is generated from rain and snowmelt events that flow over land or impervious surfaces, such as paved streets, parking lots, and building rooftops, and does not soak into the ground.

The runoff picks up pollutants like trash, chemicals, oils, and dirt/sediment that can harm our rivers, streams, lakes, and coastal waters.

Because stormwater can flow over hard surfaces directly into storm drains, there is no opportunity for soil and plants or a water treatment facility to filter out pollutants.

How can you help reduce pollutants in stormwater? Practice healthy household habits and share these habits with your neighbors:

In the garage or shed:

Check your car, boat, motorcycle, lawn mower, tiller and other machinery and equipment for leaks and spills. Make repairs as soon as possible and clean up spilled fluids with an absorbent material. Dispose of the material in the trash. Never rinse spills into a storm drain or over a hard surface. Recycle used oil and other automotive fluids at participating service stations. Never dump these chemicals down the storm drain or dispose of them in your trash.

Vehicle Care:

Use a commercial car wash if available. If washing at home, move the car to the lawn or an unpaved surface to minimize the amount of dirty, soapy water flowing into the storm drain.

Pet Care:

Always pick up waste and dispose of it properly. Flushing pet waste is the best method of disposal.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

TALL GRASS AND WEEDS
No, person owning or occupying any property within the Borough shall permit grass or weeds or any vegetation (not edible or planted) to exceed a height of eight inches this includes the curblin.

All exterior property and premises shall be maintained in a clean, safe and sanitary condition. **PROPERTIES WILL BE CITED FOR VIOLATIONS.**

MOSQUITOS

Just a reminder to all our citizens to help cut down on the mosquito population in Akron by dumping out any standing water on your property. Make sure you don't have anything like buckets, upside down trash can lids, or even bottle caps that can catch rain water and allow mosquitoes to breed.

WATER & SEWER BILLING NEWS

You need to use PO Box 130 when mailing items to the Borough Hall.

Also, for non-payment of a water and sewer bill, a second notice is sent 15 days after the due date giving the resident an additional 10 days to pay the bill before service is terminated. Please pay attention to your notices to avoid this happening.
