## FROM THE POLICE

### Imposter Scams

#### How it works:

You get a call or an email saying you've won a prize, or someone is in trouble. It might seem to be from someone you know, or someone you think you know but haven't met in person. The story changes but the request is the same: wire money to pay taxes or fees, or to help someone you care about.

Is this person who you think it is? Is there an emergency? Is there a prize? Odds are no, the person contacting you is pretending to be someone else.

#### What to do?

Stop. Check it out – before wiring money to anyone. Call the person, agency, someone else you trust. Then decide how to proceed. No government agency will ever ask you to wire money. Share this information with a friend. You may not have received the call or email yourself, but chances are you know someone who has.

### Identity Theft

#### How it works:

Someone uses your personal information such as your social security or Medicare number, credit card, or medical insurance, and runs up bills in your name.

How would you know? You could be getting bills for things you didn't buy or services you didn't get. Your bank account may have withdrawals you haven't made. You might not get the expected bill. Or you may find accounts on your credit report you know nothing about.

#### What to do:

Protect your information. Where would someone find your credit card or social security number? Protect personal information by shredding documents instead of just throwing them out. Only provide your social security number when you must. Use strong online passwords.

Read your monthly statements and check your credit, read them for accuracy. Make sure you recognize what is on them.

## STREET SWEEPING

Spring Street Sweeping is scheduled to take place April 7<sup>th</sup> and April 8<sup>th</sup> beginning between 6:00AM-7:00AM both days. The East side of 272 will be swept on April 7<sup>th</sup> and the West side on April 8<sup>th</sup>. When possible, please remove parked cars from the streets on the applicable date of sweeping. In addition, a reminder regarding tree limb height. To save time and reassure safety, please make sure any tree limbs in front of your properties are at least 12 feet above sidewalks. This will ensure that your street will get swept and emergency vehicles can travel the streets without accident or injury.

## UNUSED MEDICATIONS

Akron Borough has a Safe Medication Disposal box in the Borough lobby. Medications can be dropped in the box at any time the lobby is open, Monday – Friday 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.

## SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

As a reminder, sidewalks should be cleared with at least a 2-foot pathway within 24 hours **after** the snowfall stops. Avoid additional work. Public Works plow operators have been directed to plow as close to curb lines as possible. Although the drivers do their best to minimize additional snow rolling back onto sidewalks, in some cases it's unavoidable. Give the Borough time to open the streets before clearing your sidewalk. Again, you have 24 hrs after the snow has completely stopped. Also, snow may not be thrown onto the street. If there is an intersection located at your property, please leave a path so school children and people walking have access to the crosswalk. In the event they are calling for heavy snow, please remove your vehicles from the street to allow our snowplows to do a better job at clearing the streets.

## STORMWATER TIPS

Over winter months it may seem like there's not much you can do to prevent stormwater pollution. However, there are many things you can do to help. If you limit the amount of salt used on walkways and driveways, it reduces the amount of polluted water entering storm drains. Additionally, physically removing as much snow and ice as possible BEFORE laying salt, avoids over-application. Over-applying can cause an excess of salt and chemicals to enter storm drains and eventually waterways.

## **PAY ONLINE TWO WAYS**

### **CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS:**

You can pay your water bill without leaving your home using our online payment service. We accept MasterCard, Visa, or Discover credit cards. A convenience fee of 2.45% (\$1.50 minimum) will be charged for online payments.

### **ELECTRONIC CHECK PAYMENTS:**

We also accept electronic check payments. Payments will be charged to your checking account at your bank. You will need your 9-digit routing number and your account number from your personal checks. A convenience fee of \$1.50 will be charged for processing the check.

When payment options appear, click on the "switch to pay with check" link. When paying online, please use your account number as your reference number.

When someone comes to your door looking to sell you something, you have the right to ask them to show their permit. All solicitors are issued a permit and should have the permit with them.

## **BUILDING PERMITS**

A building permit is required for constructing, remodeling and renovation of any building or accessory structure. Except for replacing shingles on roofs, painting (exterior or interior), carpet replacement and other improvements classified as cosmetics, Akron Borough residents are required under Pennsylvania Law, UNIFORMED CONSTRUCTION CODE, to obtain a permit for all other work. The Borough Building Code Official is responsible for approving permit applications and conducting the required inspections. A permit application can be applied for and obtained at the Borough Office during normal business hours. From the time of application to obtaining the permit for the project may take up to two weeks
